Encounter Data Overview

Data submitted in this format are loaded and to the Ignite Data Platform and made available for customer licensed DaaS and Ignite Growth Platform products.

Recommended Date Range – If you are working with WebMD Ignite Professional Services, they will work with you to establish the recommended amount of historical data to include. In general, it is recommended that customers supply the most recent full three (3) fiscal years to current.

NOTE – WebMD Ignite will retain, at maximum, a rolling 63 months of medical encounter data. This minimizes your data footprint at WebMD without sacrificing platform value.

Sensitive Exclusions – Many health systems have business rules that determine what medical events are to be excluded from even Business Associate data shares. These often include sensitive medical treatments and conditions. Some systems also exclude certain patients, like "VIPs", completely. You are encouraged to follow these guidelines when preparing your data to send to WebMD Ignite.

Diagnosis and Procedure Sequencing – Each medical code sent with your encounter data is to be sequenced, to identify which diagnoses and procedures are most important within each medical encounter. This sequence impacts how WebMD Ignite categorizes (separately from your own provided service lines) your encounters into service categories that can be used for both audience creation and campaign response measurement. The sequencing can also impact patient predictive models.

Person Loading

Fully-Mastered Persons: Most data are only meaningful if we can connect them with an addressable person. New person records are first evaluated to determine if they have sufficient data to be fully mastered. Fully mastered persons are connected to all activities (e.g., medical encounters, class attendance) that are associated with that same person.

A fully mastered person requires the record contain First Name, Last Name, Street Address 1, AND Postal Code.

File Format Requirements

> Files are to be UTF-8 encoded

> Delimiters: Pipe (|) delimited or Comma (,) with optional double quote (") qualifiers per field.

Any double-quotes ("), backslash (\) or delimiters characters within any field must be escaped with a backslash, whether or not the field is quote enclosed.

> If a backslash (\) precedes an actual delimiter at any place in a supplied file, that file will fail to load. This is to protect against possible data corruption as the fields after will be ambiguous in their relative position and is most easily avoided by always quote-qualifying fields.

> If data in the entire field cannot be provided, leave it blank (no characters in the field).

> First row contains headers. These are case sensitive, so please follow the below header names exactly.

> No page breaks, footers, or data summaries / totals.

Edge Case 1: You have two lower-level groups with the same name.

You are permitted to use the same name for two different lower-level groups. Using sports leagues as an analogy: In the National Football League, the NFC East and the AFC East are different Divisions, even though they are both called "East".

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This is a valid way to build your facility hierarchy: NFL >> NFC >> East and NFL >> AFC >> East will display as distinct segments in reports and filtering.

Edge Case 2: You have facilities that do not fit into your hierarchy.

If you are providing a facility hierarchy, then every facility in your facility reference file must have a facility group specified at every level you have established.

If you have a facility that does not conceptually fit into your hierarchy --- for instance, if the facility was just acquired and you have not yet assigned it to a division --- you'll need to implement a simple work-around: create a group called "Unassigned", and assign the orphaned facility to the "Unassigned" group.

For instance, in this example, a health system has just added a new hospital in San Juan: its first in Puerto Rico. They're not sure whether they want to include Puerto Rico in their Southeast Division, or if they should maybe create a new division. For now, they decide to just put the new hospital in Unassigned Division:

If your hierarchy has multiple levels, you may need to create multiple unassigned groups. For example, this health system has two levels, a Market and a Division. They have two new hospitals: San Juan Hospital and Tampa Bay Hospital.

1. They do not yet have an appropriate division for San Juan Hospital and would like to leave it in Unassigned Division for now. They set the market to Unassigned Market as well.
2. They're not sure whether Tampa Bay
3. Hospital will be added to the N. Florida Market or the S. Florida Market. For now, they'll simply list it as Unassigned Market --- in the Southeast Division.

Edge Case 3: You have facilities that are not listed in your Facility Reference File.

This is not recommended. If you have encounters at a given facility, that facility should be included in your Facility Reference File. If you have facilities that do not fit into your hierarchy, you should still include them in your Reference File using the work-around described in Edge Case 2.

If you do have facilities in your encounter data that are not listed in your Facility Reference File, the unlisted facilities will appear in a top-level group labeled "Other".

Edge Case 4: You have encounters that do not have a facility code.

Facility code is not a required field on the encounter file. However, if you intend to use facilities for audience filtering and campaign objectives, we highly recommend you include a facility code. Filters that use facilities or facility groups will exclude encounters that do not have a facility code.
